## Detailed Companion Activities

**BATTLE OF CORYDON CIVIL WAR MEMORIAL PARK** 100 Old Hwy 135 SW Corydon 812-738-8236  
Commemorating the only Civil War battle fought on Indiana soil, which took place on July 9, 1863.

**COLBURN-PORTER LAW OFFICE** – Walnut St., Corydon, IN (812) 738-4890. This 2-story federal style brick house was built in 1817. William Hendricks made the house his headquarters while he was Governor of IN (1822-1825).

**CORYDON CAPITAL STATE HISTORIC SITE 202** - East Walnut Street Corydon 812-738-4890  
The Corydon State Historic Site commemorates the history of Indiana's first state capital. Visit the Federal-style limestone capital building that was erected in the early 1800's. The site is very informative and rich with history.

**HARRISON- CRAWFORD STATE FOREST** – 7240 Old Forest Rd., Corydon, IN (812) 738-8232 [www.in.gov/dnr](http://www.in.gov/dnr)

**WYANDOTTE CAVES** – 7315 S. Wyandotte Cave Rd., Corydon, IN (888) 70-CAVES, [www.wyandottecaves.com](http://www.wyandottecaves.com)

**LEORA BROWN SCHOOL** – 400 E. Summit St., Corydon, IN (812) 738-3376. Simple one-room school built in 1891 for African-American children taught during the days of segregation. One of Indiana's oldest standing black schools.

**OHIO RIVER SCENIC BYWAY** - This is one of the most beautiful parts of the Midwest. It boasts some of the most spectacular river views in the state. The Byway turns and twists, hugging the river at times, while traveling through river towns, past stately mansions, and scenic overlooks. Runs through county on Hwy 62-look for signs.

**TURTLE RUN WINERY** - 940 St. Peters Church Road Corydon 812-952-2650  
Winery produces exceptional quality wine which can be enjoyed with both food and friends. They offer tours and free tasting. Winery specializes in premium red, white, dry and sweet wines. Open noon to 6pm Tuesday through Sunday.

**ZIMMERMAN ART GLASS FACTORY** 395 Valley Road Corydon 812-738-2206  
With the tools they learned to use as children, Bart and Kerry Zimmerman carry on a family tradition that has continued through three generations. The brothers make 110 pieces like paperweights, fruit and holiday ornaments. Visitors can watch a first hand demonstration of hand glass making.
