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SECRETARY'S REPORT – Lisa Chandler/Tami Barrett

Holley Rose asked for comments or corrections to the July 23, 2021 (changed from July 16, 2021) minutes. Hearing none, she stated the minutes are accepted as presented.

TREASURER'S REPORT – Gretchen Quirk

Current July Budget Report (submitted by Gretchen Quirk)

The BMO Harris Checking Account balance is \$11,579.31

The BMO Harris Savings Account balance is \$4,742.87

The Fall Conference Account balance is \$22,572.30 (last bank statement)

The Capital Fund (30-month CD) balance is \$30,105.54 (as of January 2021 is now a 13-month CD)

The COPED Principal Account (60-month CD) balance is \$16,889.00.

The COPED Available balance is \$4,242.87 (which includes interest from \$10,000 former CD, \$1,000 donation, \$4,000 from 2003 Fall Conference surplus, \$571.25 from 2004 Fall Conference silent auction, and \$1,117.75 from the 2016 Fall Conference Silent Auction, interest from the 60-month CD & \$844 from 2018 Fall Conference Silent Auction)

Holley stated the July Treasurer's Report is filed subject to audit.

Jennifer Heller asked if the Association is currently in the red or black. Gretchen stated that the Association will be about \$2,000 to \$3,000 in the red by the end of the year based on the current budget which is similar to 2020. This is the result of not having conference surplus due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

AUDITORS – Catherine Hess & Matthew Herrick

Catherine stated they still need to audit the NE Chapter and EC Chapter books.

LIAISON REPORTS

BOARD OF ANIMAL HEALTH (BOAH) LIAISON - Denise Derrer

Animal Health:

BOAH is working with Indiana Department of Health to monitor the equine population in a portion of Northern Indiana for Eastern equine encephalitis (EEE). There have been cases in the last two years in horses and humans. Equines tend to be the "canaries in the coal mine" for this disease to indicate a need for environmental mitigations for mosquitoes. BOAH is monitoring the international scene with the diagnosis of African swine fever (ASF) in the Dominican Republic (this is the first finding in nearly 40 years in this hemisphere). While ASF does not make people ill or present a food safety threat, if the disease were to be found in the United States, the economic impact to the pork industry (and likewise the food supply) would be significant. BOAH is working closely with the pork industry.

Meat & Poultry Inspection:

BOAH is seeing a lot of activity with new start-up meat processing and/or slaughter facilities under state inspection. Currently, there are 37 facilities statewide that are actively working toward coming online in the next few months. This is putting a major strain on the agency's resources. BOAH is currently hiring meat inspectors. The positions are in Northeast, Northwest, and West Central Indiana. Postings are on the state job bank. Please refer any interested candidates. In the current employment climate filling these positions is challenging. These are truly critical staff as they make the difference in a small business operating or not, as well as assuring our food supply is safe.
