

Indiana Environmental Health Association (IEHA) Membership Drive

In an effort to spark interest in the IEHA, a new one (1) year membership may be given to a maximum of two (2) deserving nominees at the business meeting of the annual fall educational conference. Nominations are open to anyone employed in local or state government as well as those employed in related industry fields.

To ensure that the membership will be used to further educate themselves in IEHA and their respective career, the following criteria should be followed when picking the deserving nominee.

1. A nominee shall not have been a member of IEHA within the past four (4) years.
2. A nomination application will be sent to the chapters and should include the following:
 - a. Place of employment
 - b. Educational and professional development
 - c. Involvement in any committee, club or organization that relates to environmental and/or public health field
 - d. Outstanding contributions to field of environmental and/or public health in the last 4 years
 - e. Reason(s) the nominee has not been a member within the past four (4) years
 - f. Reason(s) why the nominee's sponsoring chapter and/or member feels that the nominee is deserving of the membership
3. The nomination application is to be returned by July 15th. The application will be reviewed by the membership committee and a maximum of two (2) deserving nominees will be chosen and announced at the business meeting of the annual fall educational conference.
4. The person(s) receiving the membership will be entitled to one (1) year FREE membership in the IEHA.
5. The membership card will be sent to the recipient(s), and a brief letter congratulating them on their membership to IEHA and encouragement to attend chapter meetings. The President of the recipient(s) chapter would be responsible for notifying them of upcoming chapter meetings.
6. The membership will run from January through December following the announcement at the annual fall educational conference and will continue until IEHA Executive Board votes to discontinue. IEHA Executive Board must get a majority vote of the Board in order to discontinue.
